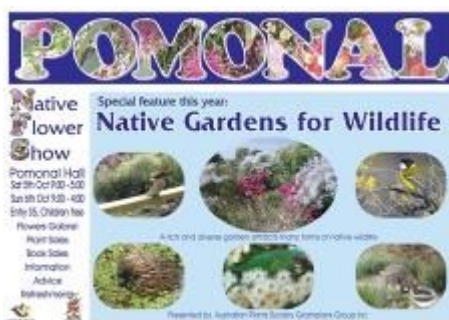
WRAP UP...

STATS BY CHAS...

September 2019 - Rainfall by Chas; 67.5mm for September bringing the progressive total for 2019 to 725.5mm. This compares to the same period last year of 25.0mm for September with a progressive total of 721mm.

As of the 25th of September Lake Bellfield is holding 59,970ML or 76% full compared to the same period last year of 67,370ML or 86% full. The total system is holding 560,311ML or 44.61% compared to the same period last year of 293,300ML or 52.35% full.

Mount William received 91.4mm for September. The highest temperature of 15.8C was recorded on the 20th of September and the lowest of -2.7C was recorded on the 17th of September. The highest wind speed of 109 km/h was recorded on the 15th of September.

Grampians National Park Access Update

September School Holidays - 2019

Throughout the year Grampians National Park may have closures in place from natural events (storms, floods and bushfires), park operations and projects. **Before visiting the park always check for closures on the list below.**

Please adhere to signs and notifications, and do not enter closed areas.

Closed Day Visitor Sites

- **Golton Gorge Picnic Area and Walking Track** – Realignment works are in progress.
- **Buandik Picnic Area** – Limited access.

Closed Roads and Tracks

- **Coppermine Track** has recently been opened and now provides access to Coppermine Campground. A four-wheel drive with good clearance is required.
- **Harrop Track** is closed until November to replace bridges and causeways.
- **Red Rock Road** is closed until late September to replace bridges and causeways.

All seasonal roads are now closed.

Remember to consider the suitability of your vehicle for the parks roads:

Sealed Roads: All vehicles

Unsealed Roads: All vehicles, 2WD use caution

Vehicle Tracks: 4WD vehicles only

Closed Walking Tracks

- **Golton Gorge Walking Track** – redevelopment works underway with a reopening date TBC.
- **Longpoint East Hiker Camp to Boroka Lookout Walking Track** – pending Grampians Peaks Trail works.
- **Ngamadidj Shelter** – Open!

Walking tracks closed due to roadworks on Harrop Track until further notice:

- Manja Shelter
- Hut Creek Walking Track
- Fortress Walking Track – only accessible from the Eastern end as a return walk. No access onto Harrop Track.
- Victoria Range Overnight Walk
- Billimina Shelter

Closed Campgrounds

- **Buandik Campground** – Limited access.
- **Coppermine Campground** – open!
- **Coppermine Group Camping Area** – Closed. Development underway.
- **Troopers Creek Campground** – Open!
- **Briggs Bluff (GR294055) & Mount Difficult Hiker Camps (GR284030)** are permanently closed.

The conclusion of the flood and fire recovery works has resulted in the re-opening of a number of sites.

* Coppermine and Troopers Creek Campground have both been completed. Situated in the northern Grampians these sites are now open for campers to enjoy.

* Ngamadidj Shelter is also near completion. With new signage and trail alignment this important Aboriginal art site can be accessed from Stapylton Campground.

Grampians National Park Update – Parks Victoria

With lower visitation over the past couple of months Parks staff have had a great opportunity to focus on the delivery of on ground projects. Along with the end of the fire and flood recovery funding a number of sites have been completed or are very near completion. This includes two new campgrounds, Troopers Creek and Coppermine. Troopers Creek provides camping sites suited to tent based campers, groups and those with caravans or camper trailer set ups. Along with great views of the Mount Difficult Range, this site is expected to be very popular.

Recruitment for this seasons Summer Rangers and Project Fire Fighters has also been taking place. Upcoming training and induction processes will welcome an enthusiastic team to help full time staff manage the high fire danger and peak visitation over summer.

The spring holidays are sure to be exciting with an excellent school holiday program. Both ranger guided walks and junior ranger programs have been scheduled in throughout the school break. Rangers will encourage kids to get active out in nature. Participants will learn about the park along with other great skills and knowledge. HALLS GAP LANDCARE UPDATE

The Grampians is one of the best places to enjoy spring. Warmer days, wildflowers, great walks.

It is also an excellent time to note the pest plants which may be establishing and becoming a problem in our valley.

Halls Gap has the opportunity to make use of the services of Ararat Landmate Crew this spring to control various pest plants around the town. This crew has been tackling a number of pest plant occurrences, mainly the introduced Kunzea and Blackberry. The Kunzea is probably the biggest environmental problem around Halls Gap and has the potential to spread well into the National Park. Another garden plant, Watsonia, is also an issue.

Project Platypus has offered to supervise Landmate works in the valley.

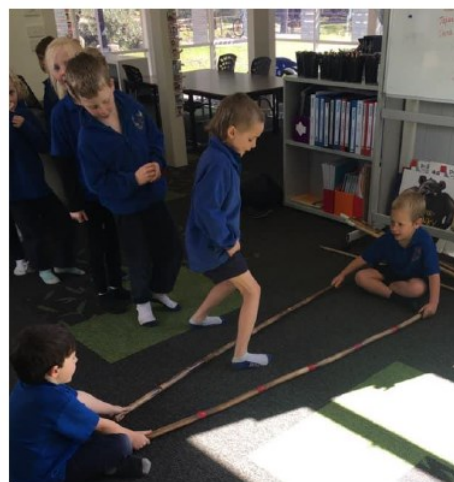
Halls Gap Primary School - September

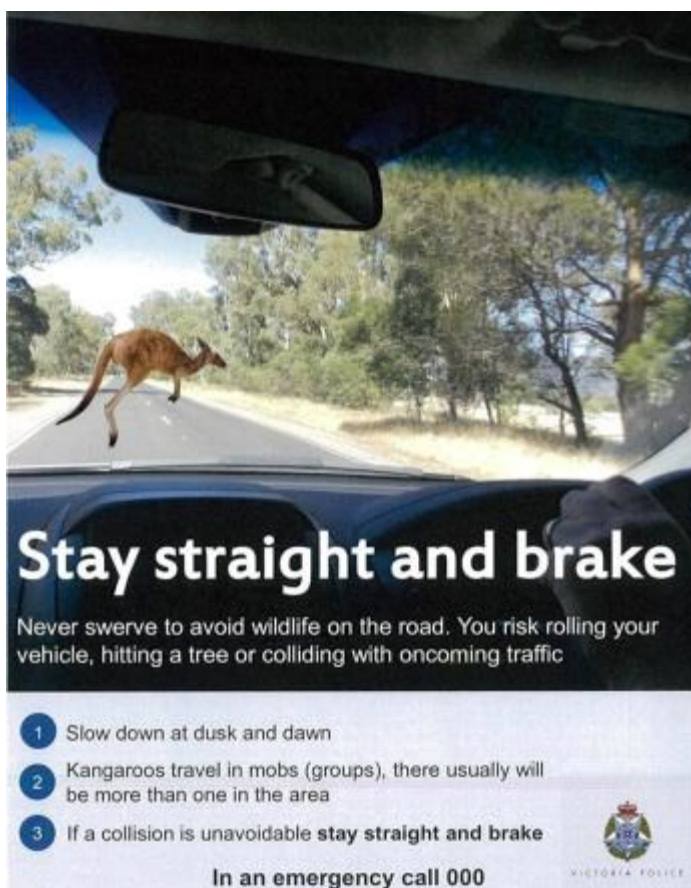
