STATS BY CHAS...

June 2017 - Rainfall by Chas: As you all know, a very dry month with only 12.5mm being recorded bringing the progressive total to 347.0mm. This is the lowest June recording since 1969 when 12.2mm was measured. This compares to the same period last year of 121.5mm with a progressive total of 401.0mm.

As of the 28th of June Lake Bellfield is holding 63,850 ML or 81% full compared to the same period last year of 43,030 ML or 55% full. The total system is holding 296,420 ML or 52.82% full compared to the same period last year of 131,020 ML or 23.35% full.

Mount William received 47.4mm for June compared to the same period last year of 164.8 mm. The highest temperature of 13.4 C was recorded on the 13th and the lowest of -1.0 C was recorded on the 30th.

How safe are you in your home?

On average, there are 3,000 house fires in Victoria. Most could be prevented by taking simple precautions. Heaters, chimneys, electric blankets and clothes dryers can become a fire risk, particularly if they have been sitting unused for a period of time.

To help minimise the risk of fire in your home

- Book a licensed gas-fitter to check your gas heater
- Check chimneys, flues and fire boxes for cracks, rust and debris
- Check electric blankets for kinks in the wiring
- Clean the lint filter in your dryer (and continue to do this after every use)
- Check appliances for visibly frayed or damaged wiring
- Complete the Home Fire Safety Checklist <u>http://www.cfa.vic.gov.au/plan-prepare/</u> <u>home-fire-safety-checklist/</u> to see if you've done everything you can to protect you and your family.
- Launch the Hotspot House to see how to keep your home safe http://www.cfa.vic.gov.au/kids-schools/ hotspots-house/



The SES had to cut him out and he was flown to hospital in the Air Ambulance helicopter. A lady had a serious facial burn when getting boiling soup from the microwave. Fortunately her eyes and breathing were not compromised. The remainder were the usual mix of chest pain and breathing difficulties.



FOGGS

Clam shrimps Day June 18

In June 2016 a new species of Clam Shrimp was found in a rock pool at Flat Rock,



in the Northern Grampians. and Professor Brian Timms who studies invertebrate biodiversity in a variety of temporary waters across the inland was interested in investigating further. FOGGs decided to assist this June.

In the morning, armed with instructions from Bill Gardner and Professor Timms, volunteers went to several different high up areas across the park to collect samples of water and inhabitants. Then we met up at Laharum for Brian to check what was found and to tell us more about these surprising creatures.



- 1. Lots were found on Flat Rock, Hollow Mountain and Mt Stapylton...including another new species... limited to that area? None found at Mt William or Lost Lake or track from Beehive falls to Briggs bluff. However the museum has recorded species from Mt Difficult in the past.
- 2. One person brought in a sample from Arapiles which was actually a different species (pea shrimp... more rounded clam shape...widespread species)... Arapiles people are going to look harder in that area

3. FOGG will monitor the Flat Rock pools at monthly intervals until they disappear and let Brian know how the population proceeds over time.

Brian is an emeritus professor and is volunteer funding this research largely personally, so FOGG can be very helpful in taking this work in the Grampians forward. So, if you are interested, ring Bill on 0438 838 286 or email:

Words that Work" workshop Halls Gap June 25

The Grampians Gariwerd branch of Rural Australians for Refugees organised a workshop to assist people wishing to advocate for refugees in how better to get their message across to others in our community. What sort of language helps, how to avoid using words that detract from what you want to say, useful starting points, and much more.

Healthy Parks Healthy People

The visitors & Community team have put the finishing touches on the soon to published and re-released *All Abilities Accessible Walking Track Guide* for the Grampians National Parkwhich incorporates new features like Trailrider information and improved maps.

The year has been very successful for Volunteer engagement and contribution. Caitlyn O'Reilly our PV/CVA Volunteer Coordinator has worked will a diverse range of volunteers achieving over 5500hrs of effort across the entire park area. Caitlyn's role unfortunately finished on the 30th June as it was funded through Northern Grampians Fire Recovery funding, but we are looking at ways to support a Parks Volunteer Coordinator position into the future.



The Environment & Heritage team have recently welcomed back Mike Stevens to the role of Team Leader. The team has been actively working on key landscape projects including Grampians Ark (Fox Control), Sallow Wattle Containment, Herbivore control (Deer & Goat), broader reserve management and fire ecology. Of note is the recent project around using Volunteers from the Sporting Shooters Association and Australian Deer Association to undertake Targeted Deer and Goat control in sensitive ecosystems. This effort, complimented by our staff and contractor programs will grow the program whereby we can become more effective in our introduced herbivore program.

The team successfully completed another round of Rock Art conservation works in May, which focused on sites in the Black Range SP

The Assets and Services team have recently completed an upgrade to the Pinnacle lookout platform with new timber treads. This compliments works completed at Boroka lookout and improvement works at Reeds lookout/Balconies walking track. The team have also taken carriage of a new Grader which will greatly assist the team in delivering its annual road management program.

The Fire & Emergency Team has had a quiet Fire Season (thankfully), but have been very active in Fuel Reduction burning, planning and delivery. The Park is implementing its winter burning regime through our heathlands with good results. This type of small mosaic type burning is growing in its importance and is perhaps a window into how the landscape was managed 160years ago.

Key strategic township burns around Ararat, Stawell, Halls Gap and Dunkeld will be a key focus in the next 6-12 months.



Park Planning works

Cultural Heritage Management Plan field work has been occurring since late May 2017, which will provide management advice around sites of Aboriginal significance including:

- The Grampians Peaks Trail Walking track alignment
- The GPT hiker camp locations

- A new campground at Dead Bullock Creek
- The formalisation of campgrounds at Coppermine Tk, Long Point West, Long Point East
- Walking track realignments at Briggs Bluff, Ngamadjidj Art shelter and Golton Gorge
- Carparks/Trailheads for the GPT, Dead Bullock Creek and Ngamadjidj.

This planning work will be finalised and approvals are scheduled by the end of September which will mean works associated with Fire Recovery can commence and the GPT development is a step closer to construction on the new stages.

Fire/Flood Recovery

There is steady progress occurring at Zumsteins: A request for quotation was sent out to Heritage Building companies to repair, refurbish and conserve the Blue Cottage and preserve and protect the Orange in line with the Heritage Victoria Permit. A Contractor has been selected and will commence works of the repairs in Early August 2017. This will include replacement of all fire damaged and termite damaged timbers, Rood repairs, Pise wall repairs, and resurfacing of the internal floors.

A tender process was run for the interpretation of the site; to capture the stories and use static and innovating technologies to inform visitors to the area the history and value of the site. This successful company will commence works in Mid August 2017.

GRAMPIANS PEAKS TRAIL

Construction works continue on the Major Mitchell Plateau and the local team has been busy walking the GPT alignment with Traditional owners to undertake cultural heritage assessments. Detailed planning continues in the background.
