STATS BY CHAS...

December 2022

38.5 mm for December bringing the progressive total for 2022 to 1424 mm.

This compares to the same period last year of 9 mm for December with a progressive total of 1096.5 mm. 2022 recordings are the highest since 1992 when we received a total of 1456.5 mm.

As of the 21st of December 2022 Lake Bellfield is holding 78,460 ML or 100% full compared to the same period last year of 58,050 ML or 74% full.

The total system is holding 436,430 ML or 77.89% compared to the same period last year of 219,150 ML or 39.11 % full.

Mount William received 24.6 mm for December 2022. The highest temperature of 29.4 C was recorded on the 27th of December and the lowest of 0.1 C was recorded on the 14th of December 2022. The highest wind speed of 102 km/h was recorded on the 28th December 2022.



January 2023

10.5 mm for January 2023, this compares to the same period last year of 99 mm for January 2022.

As of the 25th January 2023 Lake Bellfield is holding 76,600ML or 98% full compared to the same period last year of 57,000ML or 73% full.

The total system is holding 407,040ML or 75.65% full compared to the same period last year of 206,440ML or 36.84% full.

Mount William received 7.6mm for January 2023. The highest temperature of 29.1 C was recorded on the 14th of January and the lowest of 2.4 C was recorded on the 19th January 2023. The highest wind speed of 81 km/h was recorded on the 15th January 2023.

The Fire Danger Period is now in force for the Northern Grampians. This means there is legislation and both state and Local Governments Regulations that apply when you wish to light a fire. It is important that all residents and visitors adhere to the guidelines, regulations and laws that are in place. Visit the CFA website and check fire restrictions and the "Can i Or Cant I" tab and for local laws visit the Northern Grampians Shire website. You can also get in contact with Rob the local community safety officer via the FB page and we can arrange for a hard copy of the document and other helpful information.

We currently have information about the new Fire Danger Rating system and Plan and Prepare information available. Both will help with making decisions if you are deciding on whether to stay and defend your property or triggers on when to leave early this bushfire season. Again get in touch with Rob.

FYI - Last year and early this year camp-fires left unattended and fires lit during a total fire ban day accounted for the majority of our call outs for last Fire Season. Please be aware that Fines and Possible Jail Sentences can be imposed by the Court if a person is found guilty of an offence. We do report suspicious and reckless acts where fire is concerned to Victoria Police. It is also important that members of the public report any suspicious behaviour to 000 or crime stoppers 1800 333 000



The below table is the FDI explained in minor detail. Basically this helps fire fighters and control agencies decide on what action to take and what resources maybe be required should a fire take place.

These ratings take into account the type of environment and vegetation in a fire district as well as weather information.

The fire danger rating can help you make an informed decision on what action you will take, should a fire start and provides information on it's potential to impact the area you live in.

Possible Halls Gap Sandbag Facility

Due to the steep sides of the Fyans Creek valley, flash flooding occurs very quickly in Halls Gap, with little warning. An effective response by the SES or council is not possible as time is too short, and access to Halls Gap along Grampians Road can be quickly cut by fast flowing water. Because of this,

the initial flood response needs to be self-managed by the Halls Gap community. However, to date there

has been no formal arrangements to support this, and there is no local SES sub-unit in the town. Responsibilities have not been allocated, and basic resources such as sandbags, sand, sandbag filling frames, etc., are not in place.

To address this, the SES has proposed that we establish a Halls Gap Sandbag Facility. This would involve the purchase of a 20ft shipping container, and its transport to Halls Gap. Parks Victoria have agreed to store the container at a depot on behalf of the community (see photos of a similar facility in Skipton.)

The container would be stocked with Sandbags and rolls of plastic (provided free by SES) Pallets to stack filled sandbags (provided free by SES)

A Bag Trolley for shifting sandbag bundles Shovels and Brooms Safety Bollards and SES Barrier Tape

Bottled Water

Rope

A response team would need to be established, drawn from community volunteers, and trained by the SES. Volunteers would only be required when a flood event occurs, and they would only need to operate the facility until the SES arrives on-site i.e. it would be a very limited commitment.

We all have a vested interest in managing the

impact of flash flooding on homes and businesses in the community. If you are prepared to volunteer, or just want to tell us you support establishing such a facility, let us know.

Community Alert Sirens

In the event of an emergency, warnings need to be issued for the purpose of protecting life and property. One option for such warnings is to use community alert sirens.

Any sirens must comply with the Emergency Management Victoria *Policy and Guidelines*. In particular the need for sirens must be identified and supported by the community, and assessed and approved, before being installed.






History Group





The shed is very welcoming to new members or anyone interested. Feel free to drop in and have a look at what we are up to or for any information contact Russ Kellett on 0438 024 929.




