STATS BY CHAS...

July 2024 - Rainfall by Chas: 144.5 mm for July bringing the progressive total for July 2024 to 395.5 mm. This compares to the same period last year of 105.5 mm for July with a progressive total of 635.5 mm.

As of the 31st of July Lake Bellfield is holding 68,220ML or 87% full compared to the same period last year of 75,990ML or 97% full. The total system is holding 314,000ML or 56.04% compared to the same period last year of 413,020ML or 73.71% full.

Mount William received 191.4 mm for July 2024. The highest temperature of 10.3 C was recorded on the 6th July and the lowest of - 2.2 C was recorded on the 28th July 2024.

The highest wind speed of 135 km/h was recorded on the 24th July 2024.




