May 2025 - Rainfall by Chas:

25.5 mm for May bringing the progressive total for 2025 to 169 mm. This compares to the same period last year of 22 mm for May with a total of 187.5 mm for 2024.

As of the 28th of May Lake Bellfield is holding 51,190 ML OR 65% full compared to the same period last year of 67,820 ML or 86% full. The total system is holding 207,510 ML or 37.04% compared to the same period last year of 309,290 ML or 55.20%

Mount William received 43.0 mm for May 2025. The highest temperature of 16.3C was recorded on the 5th of May and the lowest temperature of -0.3C was recorded on the 18th May 2025. The highest wind speed of 122 km/h was recorded on the 25th May 2025.

Pomonal Hosts New Community-Led Festival Celebrating Recovery, Regional Spirit and Local Talent

Take Another Breath – Grampians is a new two-day festival launching this June in Pomonal, created to celebrate resilience, showcase regional excellence, and support recovery following the catastrophic 2024/25 bushfires.

Held on Friday 20 and Saturday 21 June, the event brings together local food, wine, live music and community spirit, set against the stunning natural backdrop of the Grampians. It aims to drive visitation to Pomonal and the surrounding areas, creating long-term economic benefits and laying the foundation for a sustainable annual event.

"This is about more than just a great weekend out it's about supporting local producers, artists, and businesses while telling a story of recovery and renewal," said organisers. "The community has come together to build something really special."

The program kicks off Friday night at Barney's Bar & Bistro with an Italian-inspired dinner created by in-house chef Altin, using locally sourced ingredients. The menu will be matched with Italian varietal wines from Black & Ginger Wines, Fratin Brothers, and SubRosa Wines, hand-picked by sommelier Simon Freeman, and served by the winemakers themselves.

Saturday's main festival day, also hosted at Barney's, will feature a full lineup of regional musicians including Orange Whip, The Doodads, The Double Agents, Riley Mason, and DJ Tom Connor, with Russ Kellett as MC. Festivalgoers can browse over 20 artisan and producer stalls, indulge in food truck fare from Valhalla BBQ and The Snack Shack, and enjoy plenty of family-friendly entertainment.

Children's activities will include face painting, a bucking bull, and guest appearances from HallsGap Zoo.

Our Voices, Our Future Bushfire Recovery Community Forum Summary

Date: 28 May 2025

Hosted by: Halls Gap Recovery Kitchen Cabinet (informal Community Recovery Committee)

Facilitated by: Happy Changemakers.

Why This Forum Was Held

In April 2025, more than 60 community leaders, volunteers, and residents came together at a community forum in Halls Gap. The event aimed to reflect on the recovery journey following recent bushfires in December 2024 and to shape a shared vision for a stronger, more resilient community.

This summary captures key messages, shared hopes, and practical ideas that emerged during the forum. The input was gathered through small group conversations, whole-of-room discussions, and written feedback. The Forum was supported by The Building Community Resilience Project, funded by Northern Grampians Shire Council and Victorian Government.

Reflections on Community-Led Recovery

Participants widely acknowledged the positive shift from a tourism-focused response to a broader community-led recovery. The formation of the Halls Gap Recovery Kitchen Cabinet (Kitchen Cabinet) as an informal community recovery committee has helped bushfire recovery be a more inclusive and welcoming process.

What People Shared:

- The recovery process has created new connections and brought residents, part-time locals, and newcomers closer together.
- Local leadership and communication were appreciated, though there is still room to improve how information is shared across the community and beyond ie. media.
- Some felt there is a need to better connect residents and business owners, as well as to strengthen ties with nearby Pomonal.
- Participants valued being involved and acknowledged that even attending events made a difference.
- Strong support for the Kitchen Cabinet to develop a statement of purpose and apply to be an ongoing auspiced subcommittee of the Halls Gap Community Association Inc, Plus develop an expressions of interest process for the community to get involved broadly.

Visions for the Future

Many participants expressed a strong desire to build a future that supports residents as much as visitors. There was widespread support for enhancing liveability, strengthening social ties, infrastructure, and improving emergency and disaster preparedness.



Shared Priorities:

- Increase housing and long-term rental options to attract and retain residents.
- Establish a shared community hub and make better use of existing spaces.
- Create stronger ties between Halls Gap and Pomonal to ensure a united approach.
- Strengthen local emergency planning and support networks.
- Encourage proactive planning for businesses and build in more year-round community resilience.
- · Improve communication channels, including digital accessibility and community media.

Ways People Want to Contribute

Community members expressed strong interest in being part of future projects and solutions, with many offering time, skills, and energy.

Key Suggestions:

- · Provide clear invitations and accessible information about how to get involved.
- Use a variety of communication tools to ensure everyone is reached, including new residents and absentee landholders.
- Support grassroots involvement through volunteering, working groups, and participation in key decisions.
- Recognise and match individual skills to local needs.

Ideas for Funding and Support

Participants were realistic about financial limitations and keen to explore practical solutions. There was strong interest in being proactive and reducing reliance on external grants alone.

Notable Ideas:

- Improve coordination and use of existing resources.
- Seek targeted support from Northern Grampians Shire Council and funders.
- · Consider mechanisms such as a local tourist levy to fund key initiatives.
- Continue building partnerships across sectors to support both business and community wellbeing, social and economic development and protect and enhance the natural environment.

Next Steps


