March 2024 Rainfall by Chas: 2.5 mm for March 2024 bringing the progressive total to 105 mm. This compares to the same period last year of 23 mm for March and a progressive total of 74 mm.

Lake Bellfield is holding 70,230 ML or 89% full compared to the same period last year of 71,500 Ml or 91% full.

Mount William received 7 mm for March 2024. The highest temperature of 31.4 C was recorded on the 9th of March and the lowest temperature of 2.5 C was recorded on the 20th and 21st of March 2024. The highest wind speed of 81 km/h was recorded on the 19th of March 2024.

March has again been a very challenging time for both the shed and our entire community as we have had to deal with the impact of the catastrophic bushfires of Tuesday 13th February. We have continued passing on donated tools and shed items to bushfire victims which have been coming in from men's sheds, service groups, businesses and individuals from all over the state and a few from interstate. Our members have been busy sorting out stuff into categories for easy viewing and making sure that all electrical items are test and tagged for safety.

We attended a dinner at Ararat RSL this month with a guest speaker talking on "Supporting friend in crisis" for our members and their partners which was very well attended.

The shed earnt some well needed funds by helping with the Grampians Arts week by setting up and packing up their venues – making it a fun social time in the process.

We were in a Pumpkin growing contest with Ararat and Stawell men's sheds in which Ararat Won and Stawell lost – meaning Stawell shed owes us both a BBQ. The judging was at the Moyston Easter Market.

Monday's from 9-30am we meet for our weekly social session where we usually solve a variety of the worlds problems over a hot cuppa and snack. Every Monday morning, we are running a woodwork session with students from Pomonal Primary school, which is a great time for the students and our members alike.

Thursday's from 9-30am we have had busy Project sessions with lots of different projects on the go in the workshop. We are slowly producing some items for sale at the monthly markets. We also have a BBQ lunch at least one of these sessions per month.

Wednesday from 1pm in the meeting room we have had our Patchwork session with our female members doing a variety of patchwork and sewing projects enjoying some girl time over a hot cuppa and good humour.

The all inclusive sessions to include our female members every 2nd Tuesday evening form 7pm – 9pm are running very well with good attendances. We have also seen members making extra time for more nightly sessions as required with the shed being used a lot more.

WAMA UPDATE – Gallery Building and Nature Play Day, April 7

GRAMPIANS GRAPE ESCAPE SUPPORTS THE LOCAL COMMUNITY WITH FEEL GOOD FRIDAY

Friday May 3, 2024, Halls Gap Feel-Good-Friday is returning to Grampians Grape Escape to kick start the festival weekend with a show of local spirit, and resilience to

help support the towns and exhibitors affected by the summer bushfires in the Grampians and Pyrenees. More than just a night of live music, this feel-good gathering will spotlight local artists, provide sales opportunities to the wineries impacted by the fires,



and offer a place for the community to come together during this time of rebuilding. The stage is set to host local bands, Soulty, Trazepoid, No Plans, The Settlement, and Orange Whip, a festival favourite from a few years ago, eager for a big comeback.

Feel-Good Friday tickets are now available, starting at just \$40 for early birds. In partnership, Grampians Grape Escape (GGE), Tivey & Holland Nevetts Lawyers, and Christian's Bus Co. are offering free entry and transfers to Feel-Good Friday this year for all residents of Pomonal. This gesture will provide them with a chance to catch up with friends and family from the region and enjoy a well-deserved night off. Kate Kirkpatrick, Festival Co-Director, Grampian Grape Escape, said: "The Grampians National Park, Gariwerd, was relatively unaffected by the bushfires, however some of the surrounding areas were, in particular Pomonal. Our local operators experienced a downturn in tourists over the weeks when roads were being cleared and bookings were cancelled due to uncertainty. Thankfully the region is well and truly open, and we're working hard to ensure Grampians Grape Escape fills beds, provides a place to come together and a chance to support local businesses through sales at stalls."

Feel-Good Friday's high energy sets the tone for the weekend with promises to blend great music and community camaraderie and showcase the connection and resilience of the region. Festival goers can support Pomonal Estate, Mountainside Wines, and the festival at the bar as well as order delectable foodie bits from select food trucks. There are very limited collection areas within the Gariwerd landscape due to the impact of bushfire. As a result, any available collection areas will be gradually opened throughout the autumn period. At present (14/03/2024) the nearest area is the east side of Brynterion Plantation (4WD access only) close to Lubeck.

Autumn Planned Burns

Forest Fire Management Victoria (FFMVic) including Parks Victoria will commence the Autumn planned burning program in Grampians (Gariwerd) National Park and surrounding reserves as soon as conditions are suitable.

Each burn is part of a three-year Joint Fuel Management Program that outlines where FFMVic (including Parks Vic) and Country Fire Authority (CFA) intend to carry out fuel management works. You can view this plan on the Forest Fire Management Victoria website at https://www.ffm.vic.gov.au/bushfire-fuel-and-risk-

management/joint-fuel-management-program

Although burns are scheduled to take place in a certain year and sometimes in a particular season, this can change depending on weather and local conditions. Due to this, FFMVic is unable to give you an exact date when burns will go ahead – notifications will be sent out once burns are set for ignition, however the final decision to proceed can only be made on the day of the burn, following monitoring of weather conditions and local fuel moisture levels. We recommend that you regularly seek information about proposed burns near you to stay informed about when the burn may occur.

Grampians (Gariwerd) National Park Update

Autumn planned burn program to commence soon

Forest Fire Management Victoria (FFMVic) will commence the Autumn Planned Burning Program in Grampians (Gariwerd) National Park and surrounding reserves as soon as conditions are suitable.

These planned burns have been nominated and approved as part of the FFMVic three-year Joint Fuel Management Program for the Wimmera Fire District. Each burn has been designated to a year and season, though this may change depending on burn objectives and seasonal conditions. You can view the full threeyear plan at <u>https://www.ffm.vic.gov.au/bushfire-fuel-and-risk-management/joint-fuel-management-</u> <u>program</u>

- The map attached, outlines the burns programmed for this year. Detailing the exact date and time of ignition can be difficult and the final decision to proceed may only be made on the day of the burn once resources, weather conditions and local fuel moisture levels are deemed suitable. Once a burn is sched-uled for ignition, FFMVIC will send out regular notifications.
- Some of the planned burns this Autumn may involve the temporary closure of visitor sites, roads and campgrounds within Grampians Gariwerd National Park and other reserves. This may include detours or closures of hike in campgrounds along the Grampians Peaks Trail, and other vehicle-based campgrounds.
- Closures will be enforced for the duration of ignition and may remain in place for some days. Visitor sites will re-open once the burn is declared safe.
- We recommend that you seek information and stay informed about the status of the planned burns scheduled near you.
